

True to its commitment to the art of our time, in recent years the Fundación María Cristina Masaveu Peterson has embarked on a new line of work focused on urban art. All the pieces in question, the result of patronage or collecting, are incorporated into the Foundation's art collection.

As a reflection of this initiative, in October 2021 the FMCMP opened a new space devoted to street art in its Madrid headquarters where the Foundation's latest acquisitions and new commissions are displayed in rotation. They span the variety of disciplines and freedom of formats characteristic of this new art trend.



As they walk round, visitors will discover works by internationally renowned artists such as Banksy, Keith Haring, Yayoi Kusama and Kaï, as well as others by well-established or up-and-coming Spanish artists including Marria Pratts, Ela Fidalgo, Marina Tellme, Luis Pérez Calvo and Hugo Alonso.

These pieces are joined by a further three produced under the Foundation's patronage by Estudio Pedrita, Juan Díaz-Faes and Queen Andrea. The last two were designed specifically for this space and will not leave spectators indifferent.

Sinstelación (2021) was created by Oviedo-born Juan Díaz-Faes on metal air ducts. The design, in black on a yellow ground and featuring the artist's characteristic patterns, which cover the entire surface, has a particular texture that reminds the artist of salamanders. This is the first time he has worked on this type of support, which posed additional problems apart from its material, namely its three-dimensionality and its complex location that made laying out and adapting the composition difficult.

**Díaz-Faes**, an urban artist and designer, studied fine arts at the University of Salamanca. He started out in magazine illustration, advertising and comics. Since 2017 he has been intensely involved in producing artwork on walls in various parts of the world, combining visual humour with voluminous forms in crowded compositions with few human figures.



La neoyorquina Andrea von Bujdoss, más conocida como **Queen Andrea**, es una de las más célebres artistas del grafiti femenino en Estados Unidos. Formada en diseño gráfico en la Parsons School of Design de Nueva York, ha trabajado en ese ámbito para diversas revistas, así como en publicidad y diseño de ropa. Actualmente combina la práctica como grafitera y el muralismo con su ocupación como diseñadora, tipógrafa y artista plástica.

Como en buena parte de su producción mural, en la presente intervención, realizada en 2021 en los montacargas del edificio, Queen Andrea recurre al empleo de un lema, **«Always Play»** (Jugar siempre), un mensaje alentador que parte del ya representado en una obra de la artista adquirida por la Fundación en 2020 y que, como en aquella ocasión, es tratado con colores vibrantes e invita a la acción y a disfrutar del sentido lúdico de la vida.
